#### **CIRCULAR N° 014**

Estimados Exportadores de Arándanos:

La presente tiene por objeto informar respecto del estado de avance de la investigación de los EE.UU. de América relacionada a los arándanos importados por dicho país, la cual está siendo conducida por parte del US International Trade Commission (USITC).

Este proceso implicará cumplir con un estricto programa de actividades, entre las cuales se contempla responder un cuestionario por los exportadores y productores de los distintos países exportadores de arándanos a los EE.UU., cuyo plazo vence el próximo 16 de noviembre.

Considerando lo complejo del sistema de investigación, se ha concordado con nuestras autoridades contratar en forma conjunta los servicios profesionales de la oficina de abogados Steptoe International, lo que contempla el proceso administrativo ante la USITC y las acciones del lobby posteriores, cuyos costos se estiman en alrededor de los USD 550 mil.

De acuerdo a lo indicado, estimamos que el costo que deberá aportar el sector privado se estima en el orden de los USD 350 mil, lo cual contempla el 50% del costo de los abogados, más otros gastos de carácter logístico. Con el fin de solventar estos gastos, se ha definido una cuota de USD 4 por tonelada exportada a todos los destinos durante la temporada 2020-2021, la que será cobrada mensualmente en función del volumen exportado el mes anterior. Terminado el proceso, se realizará una rendición de cuentas y los eventuales saldos serán reintegrados a los exportadores.

Con el objetivo de informar respecto de esta imporante materia, los costos asociados, las etapas del proceso, y en particular, sobre detalles importantes a considerar para completar los cuestionarios para exportadores y productores exigidos por la USITC, deseamos invitarlos a una reunión extraordinara.

Dicha reunión se realizará este jueves 22 de octubre a las 12:00, a tavés de la plataforma Zoom, oportunidad en la cual se contará con la participación del Subsecretario de la SUBREI, señor Rodrigo Yáñez.

<u>Background.</u>--This investigation was instituted in response to a request filed on September 29, 2020, by the United States Trade Representative ("USTR"). Import relief may be imposed by the President on U.S. imports of blueberries as a result of this investigation if the Commission makes an affirmative injury determination and recommends to the President that he impose relief. The President may impose relief in the form of increased duties and/or other restrictions on imports of blueberries that are the subject of an affirmative injury determination.

Blueberries. -- The blueberries covered by this proceeding are fresh, chilled, or frozen blueberries.

- Fresh or chilled blueberries are currently imported under the following statistical reporting numbers of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS): 0810.40.0029 (cultivated blueberries, including highbush, fresh or chilled); 0810.40.0026 (certified organic blueberries, fresh or chilled); and 0810.40.0024 (wild blueberries, fresh or chilled).
- Frozen blueberries are currently imported under HTS statistical reporting numbers 0811.90.2024 (wild blueberry, uncooked or cooked by steaming or boiling in water, frozen); 0811.90.2030 (blueberries, certified organic, cultivated (including highbush), uncooked or cooked by steaming or boiling in water, frozen); and 0811.90.2040 (blueberries, cultivated (including highbush), uncooked or cooked by steaming or boiling in water, NESOI, frozen). Before July 1, 2018, frozen blueberries imported under HTS statistical reporting numbers 0811.90.2030 and 0811.90.2040 were imported under a single HTS statistical reporting number, 0811.90.2028 (blueberries, cultivated (including highbush), uncooked or cooked by steaming or boiling in water, frozen). For purposes of this questionnaire, frozen blueberries refers to frozen whole blueberries, and does not include frozen further processed blueberries (e.g., frozen puree).



This issues stem from your computer number formatting setting (e.g., not the MS Word document itself, but the computer from which you are opening up the document). In the United States commas (,) delineate multiples of 1000 and periods (.) delineate fractions less than one. Many EU countries use the reverse where multiples of 1000 are delineated with periods (.) and fractions less than one are delineated with commas (,). The US International Trade Commission's questionnaires are set-up in the United States with the U.S. number formatting. When this formatting interacts with a computer set to EU number formatting, we believe this may cause this issue.


The solution to this data entry issue is to temporarily change your operating system's number formatting to be consistent with the U.S. number formatting system while you complete the questionnaire.

To temporarily change your computer's number settings to U.S. settings, please do the following (for Microsoft Windows Operating system):

- START
- Control Panel
- Region and Language (under Clock, Language, and Region category)
- Format tah
- Change the Format from your existing one (e.g. "Italian (Italy)") to "English (United States)" (see screen shots below)

When you do this the number "twelve million dollars and thirty five cents" would change from \$12.000.000,35 (Italy format) to \$12,000,000.35 (U.S. format), and then there will be no conflict with the USITC foreign producer questionnaire form. When you finish reporting the data then you can close the guestionnaire and switch back to Italy settings.
